What Can You Expect to Pay?

- **Home Prices:** Most single-family homes in Birmingham range from \$150,000 to \$250,000, making it one of the most affordable metro areas in the Southeast. Higher-end neighborhoods may go above \$300,000 but still remain well below the national median.
- **Rental Prices:** A 2–3 bedroom rental home or apartment typically costs around \$1,000 to \$1,300/month. One-bedroom apartments average about \$950/month, while larger family homes can reach \$1,400–\$1,600 depending on location.
- **Popular Features:** Many homes include spacious yards, porches, and mature trees. You'll find a mix of cozy historic bungalows, mid-century houses, and newer suburban developments, all within reach of downtown Birmingham and the surrounding suburbs.

Is It a Good Time to Buy?

Yes! While home prices have risen modestly in recent years, Birmingham still offers excellent value compared to most U.S. cities. Housing is affordable, and inventory is fairly steady, but desirable homes can sell quickly. Buyers should be prepared with financing in place to act fast on good listings.

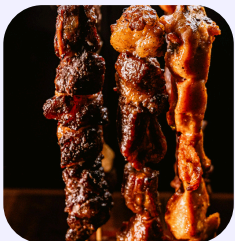
DINING & TOP RESTAURANTS

Birmingham has a rich cultural identity shaped by its role in the Civil Rights Movement and its thriving arts scene.

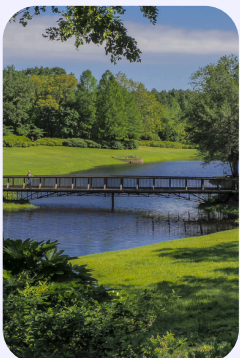
- The Birmingham Civil Rights Institute is a must-visit, offering powerful exhibits that highlight the city's pivotal role in American history.

COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS

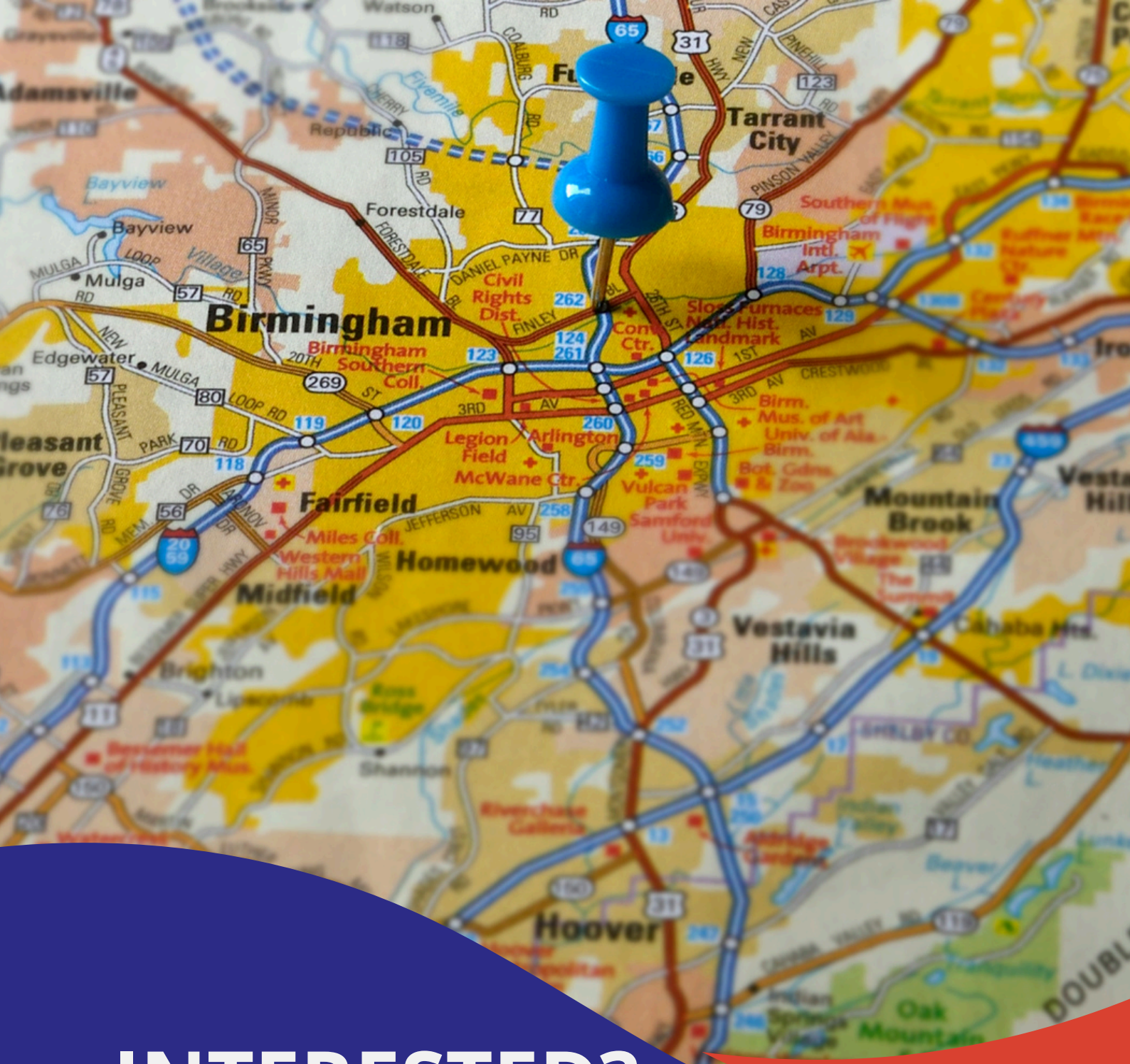
